



Summer term in Daffodils



English

As part of our writing and reading, this term, we will be using a variety of texts to write for a range of purposes, including creating their own story that revolves around a theme, writing non-chronological report and poetry. We will focus on developing our Reading skills of Inference, Vocabulary, Retrieval, Prediction and Explanation whilst studying Windrush Child by Benjamin Zephaniah.

Maths

- Our Maths learning will focus on Measurements. We will learn and practise how to add and subtract amounts of money (Year 3). As well as solving simple measure and money problems involving fractions (Year 4).
- We will look at mass, volume and capacity (Year 3) and converting between different measurements (Year 4). We will look closely at time, including focusing on analogue and digital 12-and-24-hour clocks.
- We will also look at 2D shapes.

Science

In Science we will be looking at Plants exploring the requirements of plants for life and growth and how they vary from plant to plant. We will investigate the way in which water is transported within plants. We will be looking at different parts that flowers play in the life cycle of flowering plants.

RE

Our learning in RE for the entire summer term focuses on: How might different people understand 'good' differently? How do different sources of authority, laws and guidelines help people understand what it means to live a 'good' life?

Foundation Subjects

In our history we will be exploring Ancient Egypt how they lived, why their location was important and how they have impacted us today. PE this term will focus on orienteering, focusing on map skills and striking and fielding. Our PSHE learning will focus on Economic wellbeing, investigating how to budget, money and the emotions that come with it, jobs, and careers, etc. In French we will be looking at different fruit, focusing our attention on the masculine and feminine. In DT, we will be making Egyptian Collars, this links in nicely with our history topic. Our Music learning will focus on African Drums led by the Lincolnshire Music Service.
